BHUBANESWAR- Temple City

Bhubaneswar is an ancient city in India's eastern state of Odisha, formerly Orissa. Many temples built from sandstone are dotted around Bindu Sagar Lake in the old city, including the 11th-century Hindu Lingaraja Temple. Outside Rajarani Temple are sculpted figures of the guardians of the 8 cardinal and ordinal directions. Jain antiques, weaponry and indigenous pattachitra paintings fill the Odisha State Museum. Bhubaneswar is the capital and largest city of the Indian state of Odisha, located in the Khordha district. The region, especially the old town, was historically often depicted as Chakra Kshetra and Ekamra Kshetra (Area adorned with a mango tree). Bhubaneswar is dubbed the "Temple City", a nickname earned because of the 700 temples which once stood there. In contemporary times, it has emerged as an education huband an attractive business destination.



Bhubaneswar derived its name from Tribhubaneswar, which literally means the Lord (Eeswar) of the Three World (Tribhuban), which refers to Shiva. Along with the old town, the present day Bhubaneswar has often been illustrated as the Ekamra Khetra (Temple City). Although the modern city of Bhubaneswar was formally established only in 1948, the history of the areas in and around the present-day city can be traced to the 3rd century BCE and earlier. It is a confluence of Hindu, Buddhist and Jain heritage boasting of some of the finest Kalingan temples.

It is hard to believe that such a globally celebrated institution was established by the humble and visionary Dr. Achyuta Samanta, Founder of KIIT and KISS. Starting with just ₹5,000, Dr. Samanta founded KIIT in two rented rooms with 12 students and 2 staff members. From these modest beginnings, the institution has grown into an expansive 36-square-kilometer academic township with 30 lush green campuses. Today, KIIT employs over 3,000 faculty and researchers and 15,000 staff members, making it a family of over 100,000 people when combined with KISS. The campus boasts a 2,600-bedded super-speciality hospital (KIMS), a central research facility, a multi-storey central library, a 22-storey research and innovation wing, auditoriums (including one with a seating capacity of 5,000), 18 sports complexes, numerous international-standard stadiums, 30 food courts, and a beautiful rose garden. KIIT is also proud to be recognized as the greenest campus in India.

The institution's excellence has earned it accreditations and affiliations from prestigious national and international bodies, including the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET), USA, and the Institution of Engineering and Technology (IET), UK. KIIT is renowned for its quality research, innovation, and outstanding academic publications, consistently achieving high citation metrics. It has maintained an excellent placement record since its inception, thanks to its quality teaching, learning processes, and strong brand value. In the Times Higher Education (THE) World University Rankings 2024, KIIT ranks in the cohort of 601-800 overall, while its Computer Science Engineering ranks in the cohort of 301-400, and its overall Engineering ranking is 401-500 globally. KIIT is also accredited with an A++ grade by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) and holds an all-India 16th rank by the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) under the Ministry of Education.

KIIT's contribution to sports is immense. Currently, 23 Olympians are pursuing their education at KIIT. The university has received the Sportstar Award, the FICCI India Sports Award for the promotion of sports, and the CII Sports Business Award 2023 for the best sports facility. It serves as a nodal center for the FIFA Football For Schools Programme in Asia and has been awarded the Rashtriya Khel Protsahan Puruskar 2022 for its encouragement of sports through Corporate Social Responsibility. Four KIIT students brought pride to the institution by winning 2 Gold and 2 Silver medals at the Asian Games 2022 in China.

Beyond academics and sports, KIIT has made significant contributions to the development of Odisha and its capital city. It has promoted local art, culture, sculpture, rural development, literature, and spiritualism. KIIT's story stands as a shining example of what determination, vision, and compassion can achieve, inspiring countless individuals around the world.

Despite these challenges, Prof. Samanta persevered, joining the teaching profession at the age of 22. By 25, he embarked on a journey that would not only change his own life but also transform the lives of thousands. Armed with just ₹5000, he established KIIT (Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology) and KISS (Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences) in two rented houses.





Today, KIIT and KISS stand as beacons of hope, delivering world-class education and earning national and international accolades. KIIT has become one of India's most sought-after universities for professional education, hosting 40,000 students, including representation from 65 countries. KISS provides holistic care—education, healthcare, sports, and vocational training—to 80,000 disadvantaged tribal students, all free of cost in a residential campus. It encompasses a school, a college, and the KISS Deemed to be University, the world's first and only university exclusively dedicated to tribal education. By promoting education, KISS has played a pivotal role in addressing societal issues such as naxalism, trafficking, malnutrition, illiteracy, and superstitions.

In addition to these remarkable achievements, Prof. Samanta founded the Kalinga Institute of Medical Sciences, Kalinga Institute of Dental Sciences, and Kalinga Institute of Nursing Sciences. These institutions are complemented by a state-of-the-art 2600-bedded hospital, a superspeciality center, and a cancer care hospital. His vision extends beyond education and healthcare. Prof. Samanta developed Asia's first smart village—Kalarabanka Smart Village—and a model panchayat in Odisha, both powered entirely by solar energy.

Prof. Samanta's contributions span diverse fields, including art, culture, literature, media, spirituality, rural development, and sports. His impact on sports is extraordinary, nurturing 15 Olympians through his institutions, developing world-class sports infrastructure, and promoting athletes who contribute to physical fitness, national unity, and social integration.

Despite his towering achievements, Prof. Samanta remains a humble and compassionate individual. He leads a simple life, embodying humility and selflessness while dedicating himself to uplifting society.
